Country: Germany
Hosts and organizers: German federal Ministry of Labour
Alberta Economic Development's Munich Office
Who attends: An estimated 1,500 pre-screened German skilled job seekers in the metal, woodworking, construction and heavy duty mechanical trades as well as truck drivers meeting with government and employer representatives from Alberta, Ontario and other provinces (TBD).
Description: Alberta is seeking at up to 10 companies to provide representatives to meet with interested skilled workers. The venues for each job fair will provide about 500 square meters of floor space for each company's information stands, interview rooms etc. These events emphasize job seekers directly contacting Canadian employers with actual job offers. Bus transportation between the three cities organized by the German government with costs divided among participants.
Registration deadline: **January 15, 2006** (for employers)
Costs: Employers are responsible for all travel and accommodation as well as booth rental space and conference fees.
